Building Breakout Session- Intervention Plan for 2011-2012

All District Plans for 2011-2012 1. Continuum under sanctions found in Board Policy 503.2 Student Conduct and repeat those under Board Policy 502.10R1 Bullying and Harassment in student handbooks.

2. Definition of Bullying added to Board Policy as per Olweus. "Bullying is when a stronger, more powerful person hurts or frightens a smaller weaker person, on purpose, again and again."

3. Revise "Report of a Bullying/Harassment Incident" *Harassment prohibited by the school district includes but is not limited to, harassment, including bullying, on the basis of race, sex, creed, color, national origin, religion, marital status, or disability.

4. Survey Staff re: support they need for bullying and harassment. Committee includes Dave Hoffman, Aaron Six, Teresa Beenblossom, Jenny Humphrey.

5. CPI Refresher certification- Focus on Bullying Prevention-Mary Alice

6. Make all forms available to staff, students, families, and community electronically. Reporting to be confidential- box to allow for self reporting throughout each building

7. Utilize "P.R." personnel to inform public about policy and district reporting. Reporting protocols district wide include;

a. Staff or students report incident to Behavioral

Interventionist or Counselor *They do initial paper work and make determination between Conflict vs. Bullying b. Principal or Designee (Dean of Students or counselor (Lincoln/Stewart)) investigation.

8. Forms translated in Spanish-Heather Lujano

9. Scheduled Instructional components in each building

10. Consistent building expectations (staff involved)

11. Define what is classroom managed behavior vs office managed

Policy Proposals- Erik and Curt

1. 502.10E1 New Bullying and Harassment Reporting form-

2. 502.10 Student to Student Harassment- Add third paragraph- "Bullying is when a stronger, more powerful person hurts or frightens a smaller weaker person, on purpose, again and again."

Switch locations of paragraphs on sexual harassment and harassment. Harassment comes first.

3. Look at range of disciplinary actions as per July 2005 version and March 2009 version. Compare to what administration has in student handbooks under Student Conduct- Breach of Discipline and Sanctions. Recommendation is to add these to both 503.1 Student conduct and somewhere in 502.10 Student to Student Harassment.
